Synoptic Gospels returning to Trinity

We will again be offering a group study of the Synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, (Syno-optic: same eye). All three gospels will be read in parallel format using the "Records of the life of Jesus." It is an opportunity to follow the journey of Jesus from Galilee to Jerusalem. Along the way we discover together how the three Gospels compare with one another, do they differ, and how so?

We explore the teachings of Jesus noticing the fresh insights that various translations bring to the table. We also look at how the events of Jesus' life and time, informs ours today.

All are welcome, no previous experience necessary. All that is required is an openness of mind and a willingness to be text-centered. It is good to come with a beginner's mind as if one had never read them before; or to read them again as if for the first time. By design there is no homework. Each session is complete, and all are sequential.

Centering Prayer at Trinity every Tuesday morning

Be still and know that I am God.

Psalm 46:10

What is Centering Prayer?

Centering Prayer is a type of Christian contemplation that provides an opportunity to sit quietly in God's presence, in stillness, for a greater awareness of God in our busy daily lives. We intentionally put aside all thoughts of the past and of the future, being aware only of "now". We each choose a sacred word in our mind and silently recall it to return to God's presence when we are distracted by thoughts, feelings and images, or we focus on our breath. "In Centering Prayer we believe that the beginning and the end of prayer is learning how to be still before God. Thoughts are the inevitable and normal part of Centering Prayer and by returning to our sacred word we are expressing our "intention to consent to God's presence and action within" (Thomas Keating)

We continue to practice Centering Prayer in the Chapel weekly on Tuesday mornings from 8 to 8:30 am. All are welcome. Come when you can. We remember those in need. We practice 20 minutes of silent meditation. We send cards to those in our prayers. – Spiritual Life Ministry

TIME, TALENT, TREASURE, TALENT, TIME TREASURE, TIME, WHERE TO BEGIN?

Traditionally the mark of an individual's commitment to the life of faith has been through the giving of one's time, talent and treasure. In other words, show up, show off and show me the money. These three elements represent the whole of a person and the need all people have to give of themselves fully. The temptation is to give of one, perhaps two with the exclusion of the other. In doing so the spirit is diminished. The Church is called to be in mission and cannot adequately answer the call without the investment and involvement of everyone who dares pray for Christ to be present. I invite you to answer the call to give of yourself in the way God guides you.

Stewardship is the main work of the Church

-the Rev. Dr. Charles W. Taylor, Professor of Pastoral Theology at the (Episcopal) Church Divinity School of the Pacific, Berkeley, California

The Book of Common Prayer teaches us that The Mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ" and that "the Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members." The unstated but clear implication of this teaching is that the main work of the Church is involving people in using all that is entrusted to them in carrying out its mission. Said simply, stewardship is the main work of the Church.

Thus, stewardship is more than church support; it is the use of "the gifts given us to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world." Therefore, the way we use or do not use resources to further unity and reconciliation in our homes, our communities, and our occupations is our stewardship. Yet, stewardship is not less than church support. Our worshiping, working, praying, and giving within the Church provide the support that we and others need to engage in the often difficult and lonely tasks of proclaiming the good news, loving our neighbors, and striving for justice and peace.

Stewardship is much more than a duty: it is a thankful response to God's graciousness to us. As such, it is an opportunity to praise God with our lives in thanksgiving -- for the blessings of creation; for the birth, life, teaching, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and our redemption; for the gift of the Spirit; for the Word, sacraments, and fellowship that sustain and transform us as the Church.

Stewardship is an adventure, an expedition into the kingdom where we find our lives through losing them for the sake of the Gospel. It is an invitation to offer our gifts for the purpose for which we were created - the only purpose that will fulfill us. It is a challenge to refocus our lives by designing our budgets around tithing. It offers us a way to begin breaking the bonds of consumption that involve us, often unwittingly, in perpetuating injustice and oppression.

All of god's people, within and without the Church, can learn that to be held accountable for our lives as stewards of God's gifts is to discover our own true great worth before God. We believe that discovery, too, is a gift, a gift that brings unspeakable joy. The main work of the Church is to bring its people, and through them all people, to this joyful knowledge, which will ... restore all people to the unity with God and each other in Christ.



Baptism, Confirmation and Renewal Sunday, November 3

Historically the Visitation of a
Bishop to the local parish is an

God. Those new to the church

faith through baptism and

Those who are already Confirmed but may have experienced a deepening of faith, may desire to renew their faith and receive the bishop's blessing.

Mission/Outreach Program of Trinity

After careful thought, lots of listening, the support of many of you and the blessing of the Vestry, we are pleased to announce that the face of "Mission" at Trinity is changing.

One of the key changes is the creation of a Missions Committee that will oversee all mission activities, and with a combined mission's budget, evaluate all mission activities and make recommendations to the Vestry.

Financing of the Mission fund will come from dedicated gifts, targeted fundraising, a percentage of pledges and contributions. The specifics are currently under discussion with the Vestry.

In addition, this committee will be also tasked with the following: Report all mission/outreach activity to the Vestry for approval

- Developing procedures for all financial activity and determining the best use of funds, time and talent
- Publishing activities in Tidings on a monthly basis
- Encouraging any and all to participate in the Mission Meetings.

Currently, there are many ongoing mission programs that Trinity is actively involved with. Moving forward, this list of activities will be confirmed and endorsed by the Mission committee.

Aid for Friends Cook In

Thanks to your generosity of food, time and funds Trinity has delivered over 100 meals to the local Aid for Friends freezers EACH time we've gathered for fun and camaraderie. As explained by the Central Bucks Aid for Friends Coordinator, "Briefly and specifically; recipients are referred by a variety of sources, most often by healthcare/home care workers, social workers, family members, neighbors, church members, etc. All AFF meals are delivered free of charge. Any recipient who is able is encouraged to support the program with donations, but this is never a requirement...We are different from MOW (Meals on Wheels) in having no age requirement, not charging a fee and providing home-cooked...meals by the same Visitor each week whose goal is to provide friendship as well as nutrition to the
