2014 Pledge Update

The following synopsis is compiled by reviewing the details of our 2014 pledge results January through the end of August. Typical of most financial reports, there is good news and not so good news.

Our budget goal for pledge income in 2014 was \$428,812. When the dust settled our actual pledge commitment amounted to \$408,006 from 141 pledge "units" (individuals or families). The expense budget was adjusted accordingly per Vestry directive.

Through the end of August we have received \$274,932 from 125 pledge units (67% of the committed total). This amount includes \$70,970 from 21 units who either pre-paid their annual pledge or have now satisfied their commitment. That's the good news.

The not so good news is that 14 pledge units have not, as of yet, made any contribution.

If you have made your pledge and are "current", my sincere thanks. If your pledge has slipped through the cracks, there is still time to catch up. If you're unable to fulfill this year's pledge I would appreciate some indication so that additional timely adjustments to the expense budget can be made before the end of the year.

Looking forward, the Stewardship Education Working Group is currently redesigning our whole approach to stewardship and you will hear more about that and our 2015 Pledge Campaign very soon. The improvements include ongoing emphasis throughout the year to educate us and highlight all of the good works that Trinity offers to our parishioners, the community at large, and our missions around the world.

Now here's a sneak peek at the 2015 budget.....just kidding!!

Youth Eucharist is held on the 3rd Sunday of each month, October - May. The Daily Office of Morning Prayer is observed at the same time (9:30 on the 3rd Sunday of the month) in the main sanctuary. This traditional form of worship has been part of the Anglican Tradition for over 400 years drawing from the monastic offices.

Trinity Church Partners with 5 Area Agencies on Outreach Day

On the first Sunday of the program year, 57 parishioners ages 6 and up, gathered to by participate in hands-on community service in support of 5 local agencies.



Our Parish members produced 50 meals for Bucks County Aid for Friends, 10 Linus blankets for St. Barnabas Mission of Episcopal Community Services in Philadelphia, 200 bags of school supplies to be distributed by Lambertville Food Pantry, 30 backpacks

of toiletries and food items for homeless clients of Fisherman's Mark in Lambertville. In addition, a team cleaned-up the property and completed some repairs at a local woman's shelter.

Also in attendance were representatives of two of the agencies we supported. Roni Todd-Marino, Social Services Coordinator for Fisherman's Mark spoke of the role Fisherman's Mark plays in the community; and Victoria Sicks, Development Director for Episcopal Community Services spoke of the services of St. Barnabas Mission.

Inspired by a celebration of Martin Luther King Day last January, the Outreach Committee saw the need for similar sharing of our gifts and time more than once a year. Trinity has a strong and dynamic tradition of community service including a monthly Peacemeal for people whose lives are impacted by AIDS, Tabasamu an annual dental mission trip to Haiti, and Mission Philadelphia, in which members of TYG, in conjunction with St Thomas Episcopal church, build community gardens and do other service work in Philadelphia.

Please join us to learn the various ways Trinity seeks to serve the needs of the community. The Outreach Committee meets on the 3rd Saturday of every month at 10:00 AM.

We need curtains and carpentry to make moveable screens. We need adults to help with memorization and with costumes. It will be a project worth working on, and a blessing besides!

Haiti News - Coming Home! By Kyle Evans

Greetings from Cap Haitien, Haiti! As many of you know, I originally committed to a three-year appointment with the Episcopal Church in Haiti, March 2013-March 2016. However, some exciting family news has affected that commitment-my second son (and Eric's!), Christopher, and his wife, Mistin, are expecting a baby at the end of October! We know it is a little girl and her name is going to be Macie. I have decided to complete my Missionary residency in North Haiti on October 9. I will join the Tabasamu team for their program October 9-15 and then fly home with them. I am really looking forward to being a grandmother. Having raised three boys, a baby girl will certainly bring a new and exciting culture change to the Evans family! Once I knew of Macie's arrival, the decision to foreshorten my appointment was immediate. Though my youngest son, Peter, is now 25, the memories of my boys' early life, especially the first year, remains fresh. I do not want to miss a minute of watching and participating in Macie's daily discoveries and growth into the unique human being that she is going to be.

Amidst the joy of Macie's imminent birth, it is going to be difficult to say goodbye to the role I have played as an Episcopal Missioner in North Haiti. My 20 months in the Region Nord have allowed me to be a part of ministry established and advanced for women, youth and young adults, important first steps in the revitalization of a farming school, deepened relationships with existing partnerships and the blossoming of new ones, important alliances with organizations such as Food For The Poor and much, much more. It has been a privilege to be a part of the mission and vision of the Episcopal Church Region Nord as developed by Suffragan Bishop Oge Beauvoir.

While I say goodbye to my position as long term Missioner, I am certain that I will remain connected and involved in the ministry of North Haiti, albeit from a distance. Though much has been started and developed here, much remains to be done. I ask that Trinity continue to pray for the important work being done for, by and with the Episcopal Diocese of Haiti Region Nord.

In truth, this unexpected shift in my life should come as no surprise. While well advanced in my mid-life years, I still think I am in control! God continually teaches me otherwise! I look forward to sitting in the Trinity pews again and reconnecting with the Trinity family, both those I know well and those who are new to me. I also look forward to discerning ways that I feel called to serve the needs of Trinity, the surrounding community and the world at large. I ask for your continued prayers in my final weeks in Haiti. Your prayers have been a constant source of strength and comfort. See you on October 19!
