November 16 " To Pray Is to Enter God's Silence"

John G. McEllhenney, our guest is a retired minister, author of several books on Methodist history, adjunct instructor at Drew Theological School, the author of A Masterwork of Doubting-Belief: R. S. Thomas and His Poetry (Wipf & Stock, 2013), and a good friend of Andy and Dot Scrimgeour.

This session deals with prayer-poems of the Welsh poet-priest R. S. Thomas (1913-2000), who believed that when we are silent "we live best, within listening distance of the silence we call God." So while he was steeped in the written and spoken prayers of the Anglican tradition, he thought that prayer at its best is "the deep calling to deep of the psalm-writer" (Psalm 42:7).


