Trinity Hosts Red Cross Blood Drive

Trinity Solebury will host a Red Cross blood drive in McArthur Hall on May 20 from 2:00 - 7:00 p.m. to support our Bucks County community in its urgent need for blood donations. A recruitment week will seek and sign up donors on four consecutive Sundays after services beginning Sunday, April 24, continuing May 1, May 8, and May 15.

A few facts about blood needs:

- Every two seconds in the U.S. someone needs blood.
- More than 38,000 blood donations are needed in the U.S. every day.
- More than 1 million new people are diagnosed with cancer each year. Many of them will need blood, sometimes daily, through chemotherapy treatment.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood.
- One donation of blood can help save the lives of three people.

We thank in advance all who donate blood. The need is urgent. Our local hospitals do not have enough blood to supply the needs of those in live in Bucks County; this need requires that we import blood from other states. Blood cannot be manufactured - it can only come from generous donors. Your contribution is important for a healthy and reliable blood supply.

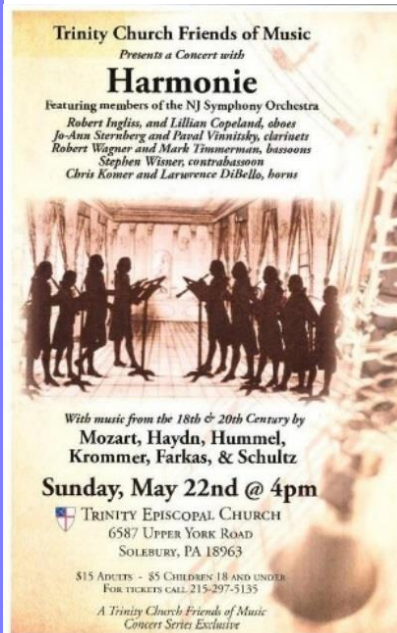

Friends of Music Presents Harmonie, Featuring Members of the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra

By definition, Harmonie is a German word designating an ensemble of wind instruments employed by an aristocratic patron during the 18th century. Due to their development and refinement before the symphony orchestra was created, string instruments dominated musical ensembles - often with a keyboard instrument providing additional harmonic support. During the mid-18th century, wind instruments entered a period of rapid development and improvement. Composers quickly replaced the keyboard with pairs of winds, which had the added benefit of bringing contrasting sonic colors to their compositions. Ever since this group of wind instruments has been known as a Harmonie.

Harmonie ensembles flourished throughout Europe between 1760-1840, and enjoyed great popularity in Vienna. Most of the best-known composers of that era wrote for them including Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven and Schubert.

The concert at Trinity will feature works of Mozart and Haydn, along with other 18th century works of prominent Viennese composers Hummel and Krommer. In addition, two newer works will showcase the Harmonie's appeal to 20th century composers - Farrenc Farkas' *Contrafacta*, inspired by Hungarian medieval and Renaissance dances; and Danish composer Svend Schultz both energetic and reflective *Divertimento*.
