Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper


Come celebrate the end of the season of Epiphany with a traditional pancake supper. \$4.00 per person or \$10.00 per family. Shrove Tuesday (also known as Mardi Gras, Fat Tuesday or pancake day) is the day preceding Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Pancakes are associated with the day preceding Lent because they were a way to use up rich foods, such as eggs, milk and sugar, before the fasting season of the 40 days of Lent.

Lenten Day of Reflection: All Shall Be Well

Saturday, April 8, 9:00 - 11:30 a.m.

We shall study *The Showings of Julian of Norwich: A New Translation* by Mirabai Starr. While there are other translations of "*The Showings*", this is the translation we shall be using. It is available on Amazon and Kindle. Dame Julian was a fourteenth Christian anchoress in England. At age thirty and a half and at the brink of death, the Lord God granted Dame Julian many revelations (showings) of God's nurturing and sustaining love. She

contemplated and prayed upon these showings before writing them twenty years later. In a time marked by war, famine, plague, and unrest, her book was the first book in the English language known to have been written by a woman. It remains one of the greatest theological works in the English language. She writes about what she sees and what is shown to her. Her theology leads us into a contemplative awareness. While she calls herself an unlettered person, she is taken seriously as a mystical systematic theologian in her own right.

Lenten Day of Reflection: All Shall Be Well (continued)

Professor Frederick C. Bauerschmidt, Loyola College, Maryland, writes: "She teaches that life is painful, but can be borne with grace. She teaches that we will never find rest in the things of this world - whether material goods, goals, friends, or family - but that we can love them and love God through them if we can see them with God's own eyes. Julian teaches that even if we never achieve 'wellness' in this life, still 'all shall be well.' We are drawn to her because we are drawn to the truth about ourselves, our world, and God."
